Rear Admiral Rosa currently serves as the Coast Guard's Deputy Director of Intelligence and Criminal Investigations. These two multi-faceted programs support the full range of Coast Guard missions – including ports, waterways and coastal security; drug and illegal migrant interdiction; fisheries law enforcement; environmental protection; search and rescue; and national defense – covering 95,000 miles of US. coastline, all US Territorial Seas, and 3.4 million square miles of Exclusive Economic Zones, and also extending beyond the United States throughout the global maritime region.
