WORKSHOPS AND SEMINAR 2017-2018





The IMO International Maritime Law Institute (IMLI), in conjunction with the Stockton Center for International Law, U.S. Naval War College held a two-day international workshop on "Human Rights and the Law of the Sea" at IMLI, 13-14 February 2018.
