The IMO International Maritime Law Institute (IMLI) wishes to bring to your attention that its Course on Global Ocean Governance will commence in January and conclude in March 2020.

In looking at ocean governance issues with the view to promote a harmonized and integrated approach, the course covers, inter alia, topics related to maritime zones management, conservation of the living resources of the sea, the protection of the marine environment and suppression of maritime threats as essential features for sustainable maritime development, climate change and its impact on ocean governance.

This course is addressed to any person involved in the drafting of national maritime policies and legislation, the implementation of the same, as well as other professionals whose daily activities are related to the oceans and their resources. For these reasons, the course would be most suitable to lawyers, maritime practitioners, officers of maritime administrations, and foreign relations experts. The course would also prove beneficial to law students who wish to pursue a career in the field. At the end of the course, a certificate of participation will be issued.

PROGRAMME

Oceans, along with coastal and marine resources, play an essential role in human well-being as well as in social and economic development worldwide. However, they are becoming extremely vulnerable to climate change, environmental degradation, and man-made hazards. Ocean governance is a topic of increasing significance and an emerging concern in the twenty-first century.

The essential role of the oceans in supporting life on earth, sustainable development, innovation, as well as in providing recreational uses and amenities, calls for a growing focus on a more effective and integrated governance and protection.

Cognizant of this need, IMO has expanded its mandate for a major and positive impact on global ocean governance, particularly with regard to the security of the world's oceans.

Considering that one of the main objectives of the Institute is to encourage research and other appropriate programmes for the development and dissemination of knowledge and skills in international maritime law, the Institute published

the seminal three-volume work entitled "The IMLI Treatise on Global Ocean Governance" in 2018. The Treatise is the result of wide-ranging research by 58 experts and is designed to assess the current state of ocean governance to ensure that proposals on this topic are based on reliable information. Making use of the knowledge acquired in the production of the Treatise, the Institute organizes this course.

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The course thus expands further the Institute's mission in enhancing capacity-building for a sustainable use of the oceans, in line with all Sustainable Development Goals (SDG), particularly SDG 14.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

This course is addressed to any person involved in the drafting of national maritime policies and legislation, the implementation of the same, as well as other professionals whose daily activities are related to the oceans and their resources. For these reasons, the course would be most suitable to lawyers, maritime practitioners, officers of maritime administrations, and foreign relations experts. The course would also prove beneficial to law students who wish to pursue a career in the field.

The course will be delivered at the IMO International Maritime Law Institute in Malta. At the end of the course a certificate of attendance will be issued.
