OXFORD UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR DELIVERS THE IMLI ANNUAL COURSE ON CARRIAGE OF GOODS BY SEA

Professor Francis M.B. Reynolds, Q.C. (Hon.) (Barrister / Professor Emeritus, University of Oxford) delivered his yearly lectures on the "Carriage of Goods by Sea" to the Class of 2013-2014. Professor Reynolds' lectures constitute the core part of the lectures delivered within one of the Institute's main subjects in Shipping Law.

Professor Reynolds gave the IMLI students an overview on carriage of goods by sea, by covering central topics on this area that share similar features in all countries, including but not limited to contracts evidenced by bills of lading and rights and obligations arising under them, international rules governing carriage of goods by sea, contracts of sales covering most consignments shipped, and the role of banks in facilitating these sales. In addition, he gave a general introduction to the problems which arise everywhere, and pointed out to the reality that the solutions offered may differ from country to country.
