The Session discussed among other pertinent issues bordering on the effective implementation of IMO instruments, the measures to harmonize Port State Control (PSC) activities and procedures worldwide including the preparation of a provisional agenda for the fourth session of the Joint FAO/IMO Ad Hoc Working Group on Illegal, Unreported and Unregulated Fishing and Related Matters.
