THE IMO CONTINUES TO SUPPORT TRAINING AT IMLI

The International Maritime Organization (IMO) supports IMLI by annually providing scholarships for deserving government nominated candidates who wish to pursue post graduate studies in international maritime law at IMLI.

The IMO relies on IMLI for the training of lawyers, particularly in developing States, so that they may have the capacity to generate national legal expertise in respect of adherence to the applicable international maritime law conventions and legal instruments. The aim thereof is the implementation and incorporation of such conventions and instruments into national law, effective enforcement of the relevant national law, and the proper interpretation of that national law to ensure harmonization with international regimes.

For the academic year 2011-2012 the following government-nominated candidates have been selected by the IMO to follow the Master of Laws (LL.M.) Programme in International Maritime Law at the Institute.
