H.E. Dr. Ugo Mifsud Bonnici obtained a B.A. in 1952, and LL.D. in 1955and a D. Litt (Honoris Causa). He practiced law between 1956 and 1987, served as a Member of Parliament between 1966 and 1994 and acted as Minister between 1987 and 1994. As Minister, his portfolio included Education, Environment, Broadcasting, Culture, Youth, Museums and Sport. He was President of Malta between 1994 and 1999. As a Member of Parliament, he took an active interest in the updating of Malta's legislation and he was a member of numerous selected Committees including the Committee set up to draft the Constitutional changes that declared Malta a Republic.

H.E. Dr. Bonnici is the author of numerous publications including the text book on 'An Introduction to Comparative Law'. His latest book entitled 'An Introduction to Cultural Heritage Law' was published in 2008.
