APPLICATIONS FOR 19TH LL. M. PROGRAMME IN INTERNATIONAL MARITIME LAW

The IMO International Maritime Law Institute (IMLI) is now accepting applications to the 19th LL. M. Programme in International Maritime Law which will commence on September 10, 2007. Deadline for submission of applications is Friday, March 9, 2007.



The IMO International Maritime Law Institute

IMLI was established by a statute promulgated by the International Maritime Organization (IMO) and under an agreement concluded between the IMO and the Government of Malta, which provided the premises and other facilities of the school. The Institute is located on the University of Malta campus. It started operations in October 1989.

IMLI offers a unique opportunity of specialized and intensive training in one of the growth areas of international law. It offers a Master of Laws Programme in International Maritime Law

consisting of education in international law, law of the sea, shipping law, marine environmental law and the drafting of maritime legislation. The course covers one academic year and it is delivered by IMLI's resident faculty, supplemented by eminent maritime law practitioners and academicians.

This course is most suitable for lawyers already working in the maritime field, particularly those from relevant government agencies, port authorities, shipping companies and other shipping or maritime related offices. Lawyers who may wish to embark on a career in maritime law could also immensely benefit from the course and may be considered for admission.

Participation in the course is offered on the widest possible geographical basis, but the number of students accepted for admission is limited because of the intensive nature of the programme. In line with the IMO strategy for the integration and greater participation of women in the maritime profession, up to 50% of admissions to the programme is reserved for suitably qualified women.

A university degree in law is a pre-requisite to admission. The course is delivered exclusively in English, thus proof of proficiency in the English language will be required of the applicant.
