



HEAD OF MEMBER STATE AUDITS AT IMO LECTURES AT IMLI



THE IMLI COURSE ON INTERNATIONAL MARITIME SECURITY LAW

The IMO International Maritime Law Institute (IMLI) wishes to bring to the attention of its readers its Course on International Maritime Security Law. This Course will be delivered between 1 March and 25 May 2022. The Course will cover the various critical maritime security threats including maritime terrorism, piracy, trafficking of narcotics, people and illicit goods, arms proliferation, and fisheries crimes. The Course will lay emphasis on the existing international laws and State practices deterring the same.



The Course will discuss the current legal developments ensuring the safe navigation of ships, protection of offshore installations and coasts of maritime States. It will also cover the role of international organizations, especially IMO, and regional cooperation in overcoming such threats, the special status of warships, and the jurisprudential contribution of international courts and tribunals.

This Course will be of immense benefit to officials of maritime administrations, navies and coast guards, law enforcement agencies, prosecutors, and other security agencies involved directly or indirectly in maritime security affairs. It will also be beneficial to professionals involved in the maritime industry including lawyers, port officers, marine insurers, shipowners, and operators.

The Course will be delivered online. Candidates who attend at least 80 percent of the lectures will be eligible for a Certificate of Attendance.
