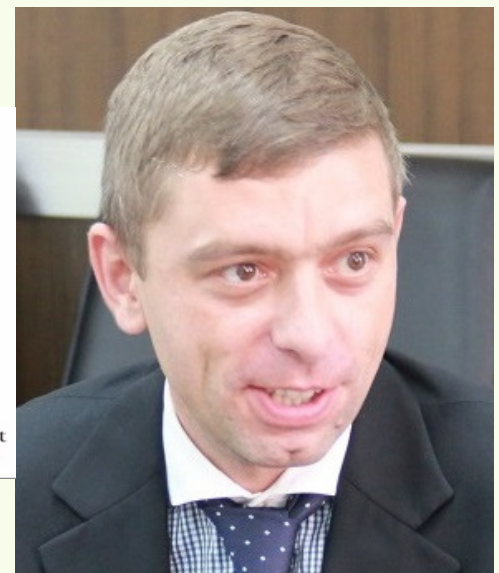
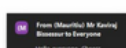
CHARLES STURT UNIVERSITY PROFESSOR LECTURES AT IMLI

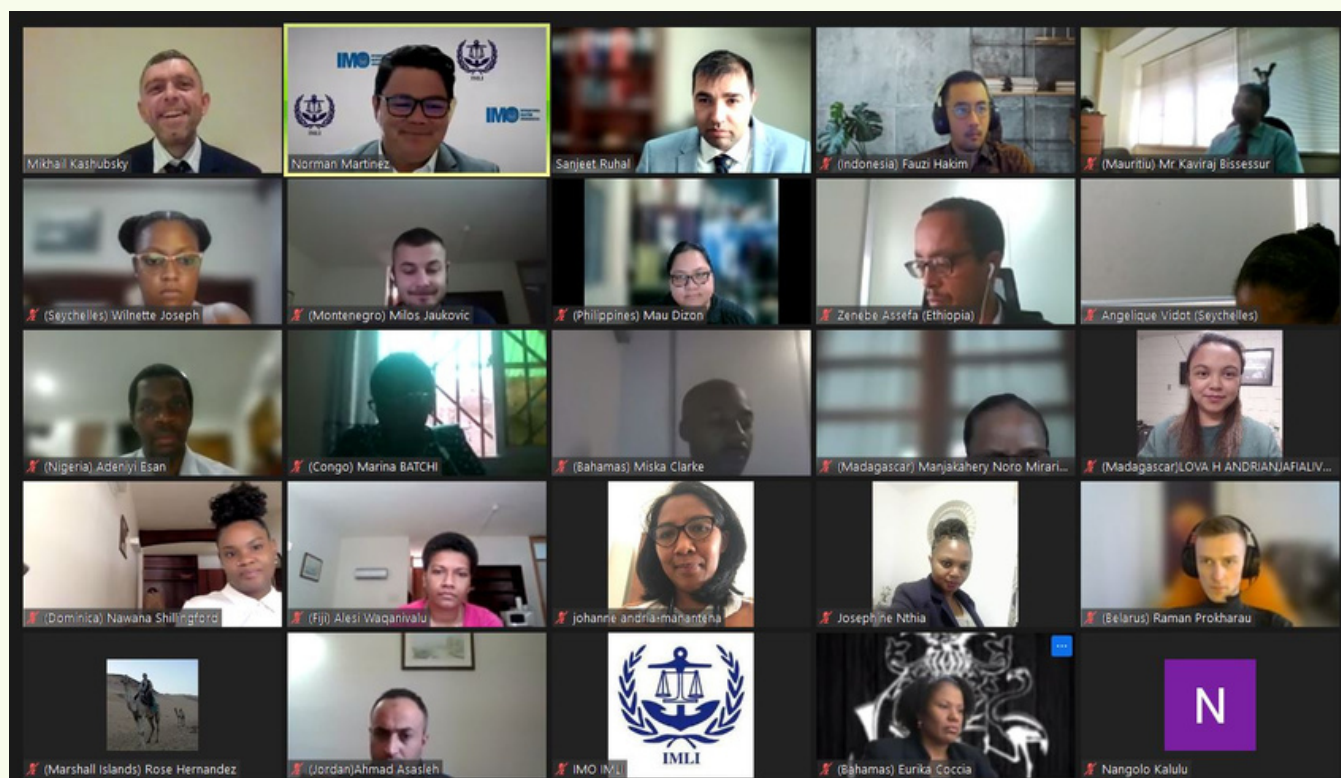
International Regulatory Framework for the Protection of Offshore Oil and Gas Installations

4. Security Levels (1/2)

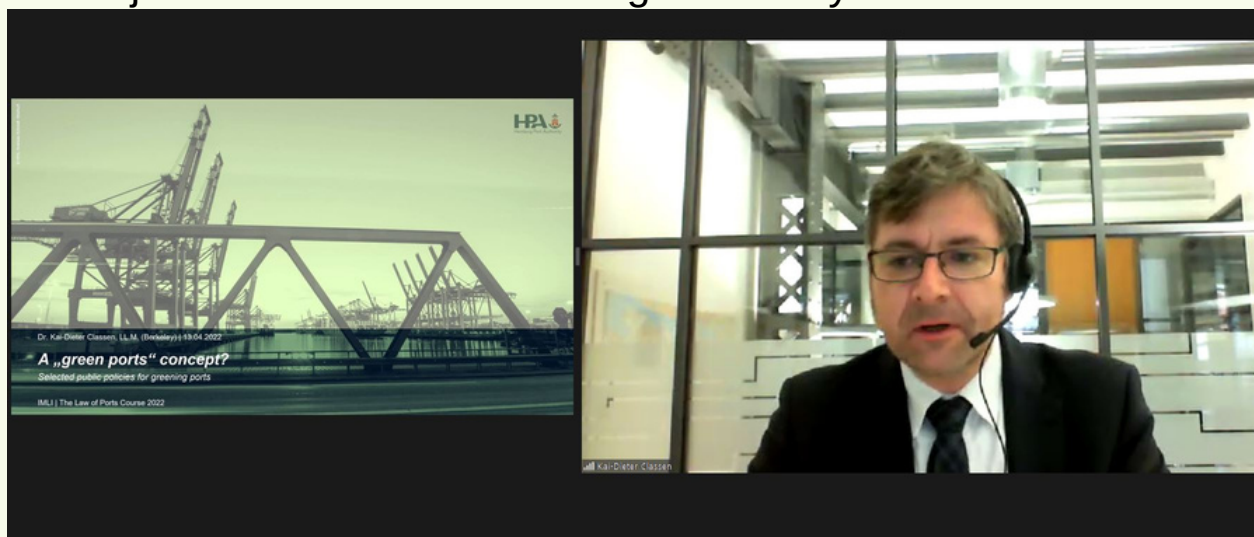
- Setting the security level is a government responsibility.
- There are few examples of national legislation that identifies the organization within the Government responsible for setting it, unless it is the Designated Authority (DA) or Administration.
- National legislation could specify who is responsible for communicating changes in security level and for receiving and responding to such changes.

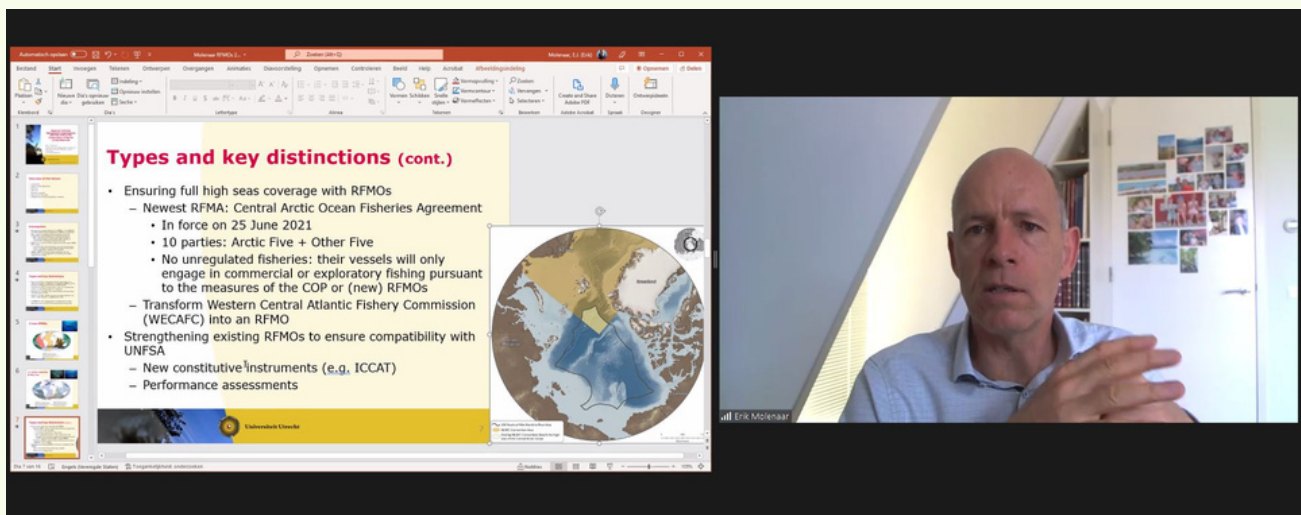

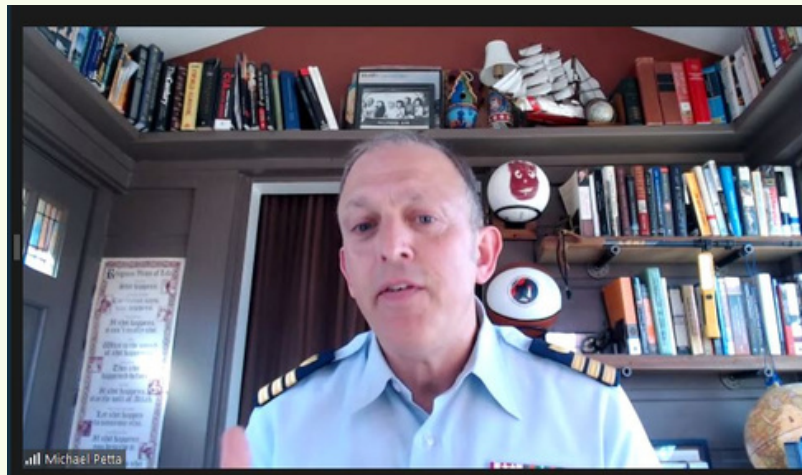
