

The IMLI Course on International Maritime Security Law which was specifically designed to address the various critical maritime security threats to the international rule of law at sea and the freedom of navigation, attracted various eminent Speakers from around the world to lecture within the Course.

Together with the IMLI Faculty, they covered in detail the gravity of these threats and the existing applicable international laws and State practices deterring the same during this specialized Course that ran from 27 March to 30 May 2024.
