For many years, the United Nations and its specialized agencies, have spearheaded the development of a robust international legal framework regulating various aspects of international law.

The IMO, alone, has been successful in adopting some 60 international treaties which aim to provide a regulatory framework for international shipping that is fair and effective, universally adopted and implemented.


Accordingly, the accomplishment of the international community's goals, as encapsulated in international treaty rules, can only be achieved if States become Parties to these treaties and effectively implement them at a national level. This, in turn, requires a thorough understanding of the Law of Treaties.

To promote capacity-building in this very important field of law, the IMO International Maritime Law Institute is offering an intensive course on the Law of Treaties.

Through an analysis of the provisions of the 1969 Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties (VCLT) and developments found in jurisprudence and doctrine, this specialized Course provides, an overview of the Law of Treaties, with lectures discussing the relationship between treaties and customary international law, the States' expression of consent to be bound by treaties, treaty interpretation, third States and treaties, invalidity of treaties, methods of revision and amendment, duration and termination, UN global and regional treaties for the oceans, and enforcement of treaties.

This Course will be complemented by lectures delivered by IMO officers on IMO treaty-making process the and implementation of IMO instruments national law, and other fundamental aspects of the Law of Treaties, drawing examples jurisprudence and from the latest developments in this important area.

It is expected that the IMLI Course on the Law of Treaties will provide the knowledge required to promote a more active participation of State Representatives in the development and working of international treaties with particular emphasis on the treaties adopted under the auspices of the IMO.
